Marc Chagall


At the end of World War II, Marc Chagall sought new avenues for artistic experimentation and turned to the medium of stained glass, which allowed him to explore intense color on a monumental scale. Working with master stained-glass maker Charles Marq, he executed 86 windows across Europe, Israel, and the United States.

The Rosary Chapel

Nestled in Vence, an idyllic commune in southeastern France, the Rosary Chapel was designed by modern artist Henri Matisse and built between 1943 and 1949. In addition to its minimalist spire and mosaic decorations, the tiny chapel features spectacular windows reminiscent of the artist's famous series of cut-outs. Each work of art features strong color contrasts and bold forms that, when illuminated by the sun, put a transcendent twist on Matisse's signature abstract aesthetic.

Thanks-Giving Chapel

The Chapel of Thanksgiving is the spiritual center of the square. Inspired by the Great Mosque in <u>Iraq</u>, the spiral-shaped chapel explores unity while representing the diversity of different faith and traditions. The aptly named Glory Window has a spiral ceiling that contains one of the largest horizontally mounted stained-glass windows in the world. It was designed by French artist Gabriel Loire in his workshop in <u>Chartres</u>, <u>France</u>. Loire intended for its progression of colors to express life with its difficulties and its joys all culminating to a point of light at its center.

Inside the Chapel of Thanksgiving at Thanks-Giving Square in Dallas, the spiral ceiling contains one of the largest horizontally-mounted stained glass windows in the world, designed by French artist Gabriel Loire in 1976. From his workshop in Chartres, France, Loire became a leader in the modern use of dale de verre, which uses 22 mm thick slabs of glass that are much stronger and thicker than the traditional colored glass of the Middle Ages. The glass is cut with special tools and then set in a mortar of epoxy resin.

Visitors from all faiths are welcome to enter the chapel, which also hosts intimate prayer services, concerts, weddings, and special events. The Hall of Thanksgiving, which is below the chapel, tells the story of the American Thanksgiving tradition, and you can see artifacts on display like the Book of Prayers and Presidential Proclamations. A spiral ramp leads down to the city and back into the world.




Judson Studios








Amir H. Fallah




Anne Elizabeth Sobieski

Artist Anne-Elizabeth Sobieski's family lost their Pasadena home to fire when she was 17. "I was frozen. I don't know how much time went by. We just watched as the roof fell in, and one by one, every room burned."

Ever since, she's had a special heart for firefighters. So perhaps it was only fitting that she was chosen by the LA County Department of Arts and Culture (formerly the LA County Arts Commission) to design the fused glass panels for the newly built Santa Clarita Fire Station 104.

Cathedral of Brasília, Brazil

The Oscar Niemeyer—designed cathedral's distinctive stained glass was created by artist Marianne Peretti in 1990. The 22,000- square-foot work features waves of blue, green, white, and brown glass.



Largest Stained Glass Window

Judson Studios and acclaimed glass artist Narcissus Quagliata are using a new, beautiful way to make glass. The result is one of the biggest stained-glass windows in the world at the Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas.

The world's largest stained glass window is actually in **the mausoleum at Resurrection Cemetery in Justice**. It contains 2,448 panels and is a whopping 22,381 square feet.

Judith Schaechter























Christi Becker

Raúl de Nieves

From his basement studio in Ridgewood, Queens, artist Raúl de Nieves creates an epic stained glass mural for the 2017 Whitney Biennial. Born in Mexico, de Nieves immigrated to San Diego at the age of nine and has been living in New York since 2008. "Growing up in Mexico was really magical because I got to see a lot of forms of celebration," says the artist. "I got to experience death as a really young child. That's what my work is about: it's like seeing the facets of happiness and sadness all in one place."

His commission from the Whitney Museum of American Art gave de Nieves the opportunity to experiment with the tradition of stained glass, and combine this new light-infused installation with existing figurative sculptures. With gaffers tape, paper, and color gels, de Nieves created a narrative that begins with personal struggle and self-doubt, but ends with "a celebration of life." In reflecting upon his father's early death and his mother's courageous decision to move their family to the United States, de Nieves sees the installation as a form of remembrance. "The mural talks about this experience—this journey," says the artist, "I feel really happy that I could put so much emphasis on this idea of 'a better tomorrow' in my artwork."




